



You get 'that' call. It may be right around deadline time or out of the blue on a Tuesday afternoon, but you need to get numbers ready quick...and they need to be in an easily digestible format.



"What is the male/female ratio for all of the Graduate programs from the last three years"?

- Institutional Research

It's survey time and the IR department needs historical data. Not only do they need the data, but they need it represented in a graph.



"Which zip code do most of our parttime students apply from"?

- The Marketing Department

There's a HUGE ad campaign (that took months of hard, arduous work to create) that is scheduled to start next week, and no one knows where to focus the efforts. They need a list that breaks down where application activity is coming from.



"How many applicants are affected by the recent hurricane/flooding/etc."?

- Department Chair
